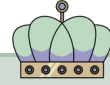

For students who have never set foot in the OAA center, how would you describe what your team does and how your team supports them?

"The Office of Accessibility and Accommodation works to ensure that students with disabilities have access to education and campus life at the University, as required by Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), and the ADA Amendments Act. As part of the office, the OAA Test Center provides approved testing accommodations to qualifying students. Testing staff administer hundreds of tests each week and work with faculty to reflect the in-class testing environment while also meeting individual accommodations. The test center has a cubicle-style layout where students can comfortably complete tests with their accommodations. Testing staff is always on hand to provide accommodations, answer questions about the test center, and troubleshoot any testing issues."

How do you advise students who feel nervous about presenting their Accommodation Letters to their professors?

"For all students who register with our office, we have a comprehensive interactive meeting. As part of this meeting, we coach them on how to use our student management system to send their letters to professors. The SMS allows the student to decide which professors receive accommodations as well as which accommodations each professor receives. We additionally coach students on why they may need an accommodation for access and connect it directly to the disabling condition. We coach on self-advocacy and how to involve our office if there are concerns or questions about individual accommodation implementation by professors. We always end every meeting encouraging students to meet with us again if they have any further questions or concerns."
